



Disclaimer for Dual/Concurrent College Courses

- Every effort has been made to verify the course information listed for each of the CTE programs.
- However, dual enrollment/concurrent courses vary by campus and by teacher.
- Also, schools may at any time cancel the agreement to offer dual/concurrent credits because of changes in teachers, instructional materials or other situations that may arise. Consequently, a guarantee cannot be made that students will always obtain community college for the classes that are listed.
- If the student does not pay the appropriate tuition/fees for the community college classes, dual/concurrent credits will not be received.
- It is important for students to realize that a poor grade in a dual/concurrent credit class will become a permanent part of a student's college transcript, will affect the student's college grade point average and the student's high school grade point average and class ranking.
- Not all dual enrollment/concurrent enrollment classes transfer to universities to meet requirements for four year degrees.
